Tuesday 20 May 2025: Annual meeting and elections

Tuesday 17 June 2025: Sergio Petrucci – Red Sky Foundation

Tuesday 15 July 2025: Ali Williams, Reinvented with Friends, Up/re-cycling

Former teacher turned designer Ali Williams is looking to help people make the most of what they have and to 'upcycle' in an effort to be more sustainable. Ali quit the classroom to set up the upcycling company Reinvented with Friends. She will show how easy it is to reuse/repurpose items we might throw out.
